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Vaccination Reminders

VACCINE**	AGES 4-6	AGES 7-18 Including 7th Grade Students

Feelin' Stronger Every Day

Whitmore Lake Public Schools is a bit of an underdog. I like being an underdog...always have. For instance, it is a strong motivator for me, personally, knowing the size of Whitmore Lake Public Schools is seen, by some, as a negative. Let them judge. I know the real story, and I love telling it.

At the end of the 2015-16 school year, I listened to soon-to-be Spartan, Kaitlyn Kelley, and soon-to-be Wolverine, Eric Mayo, give graduation addresses. They sang the praises of their Class of 2016 and told the audience of their experiences in our schools. I watched with pride as they detailed the ups and downs of being a student from elementary school to high school completion. I was also struck with how different each of these top scholars was. One pursued interests in the performing arts and the other in athletics; one excelled in language and composition while the other excelled in math and sciences. Both, however, reached the top of their class and both had their academic needs met by our district's staff and its programs. Their story is the epitome of what we do in WLPS! Their story IS the story. Isn't it a great one?

What I find great about the story is that we replicate it over and over again for each of our students. Each student is different and needs a different path and approach. Only small schools like ours can truly deliver on that commitment with as much precision as we do. I am proud of it. I am committed to it.

In an effort to improve upon the experiences students receive in our district's schools, you will see enhanced art programming at the elementary level this coming school year. We are adding a Graphics Arts class for 6th grade students. Our intent is to ready this class of students for the type of programming they will see at the secondary level. Additionally, our 7th graders will be introduced to conversational French and French culture. Finally, at the secondary level, we are expanding our AP programming to be inclusive of all students. While we previously offered AP Language only to a select few, our goal is for EVERY student to experience rigorous AP coursework in his/her high school career. Therefore, next year all juniors will be taking AP Language because of the strong English and writing skills it teaches. It will prepare them not only for their college entrance exam, the SAT, but equip them with critical college-readiness skills.

Our after-school programming will remain committed to offering as many programs as possible. We believe in keeping kids active. Our theater programs will keep younger students involved, and our high school will be working on adding another musical to its repertoire. Athletics has added golf, swimming, and lacrosse in recent years. Our next addition we are evaluating is wrestling, which we are targeting to start up this year.

Of course, none of this gets done without a balance of promoting growth in achievement and strong financial planning. WLPS passed its third consecutive budget adding to its fund balance. We have steadily improved in this important area since 2014 when our reserves were less than 1%. We are going into the 2016-17 just under 7%. Improvement? Yes. But, improvement while maintaining the integrity of our academic programming is critical. WLPS is proud that a recent study commissioned by the State of Michigan called the Education Finance Study rated our district as "successful" along with our neighbors Ann Arbor and Brighton. Do you see why I am feelin' stronger everyday?

KIDS CLUB Tuition-based extended day programs offered five days per week 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM as enrollment dictates.

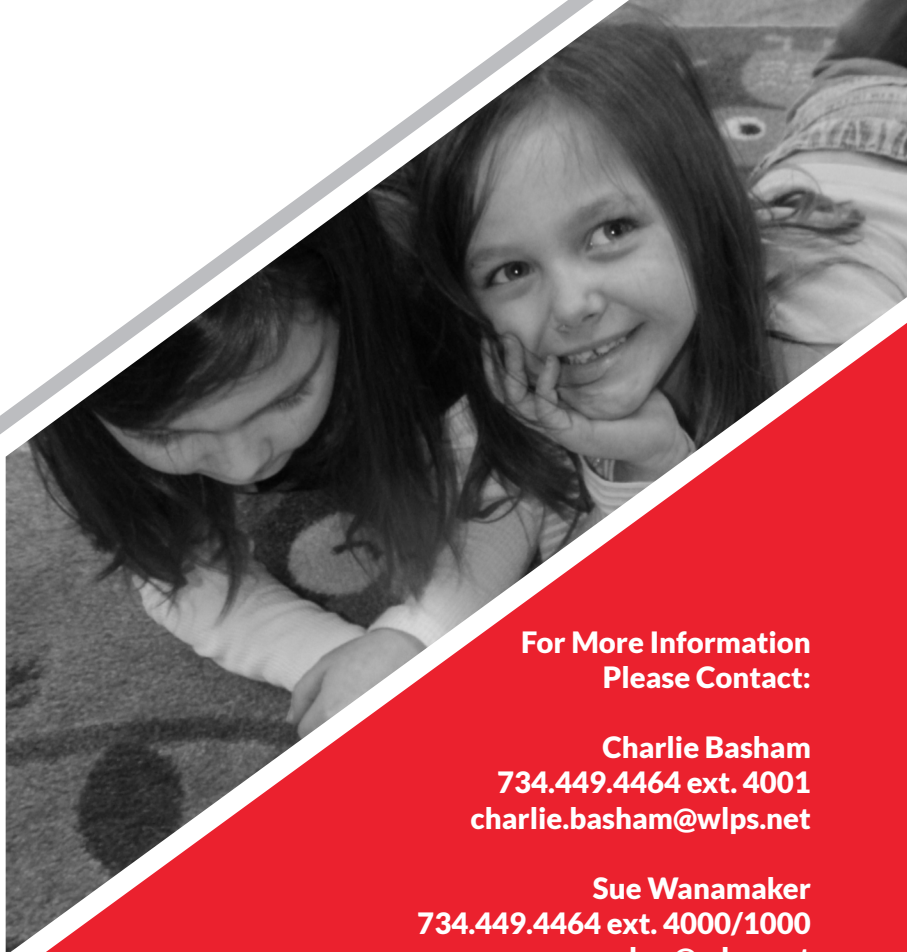
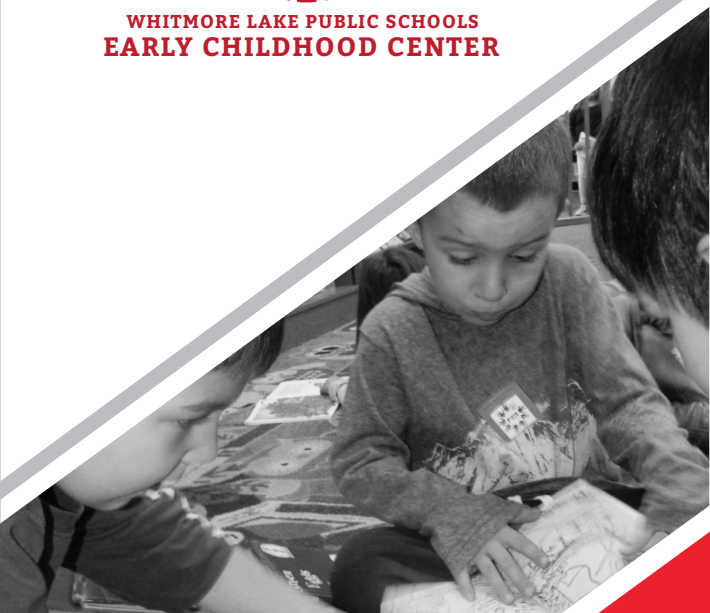

DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

If you do not want the following information available to the public, notify your building principal before October 7, 2016.

DESIGNATION OF "DIRECTORY INFORMATION"

In accordance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 USC 1232[g]), the Board of Education of the Whitmore Lake Public School District has designated the following information as directory information: a student's name; the image or likeness in pictures, videotape, film website, or other medium; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; degrees and awards received; and school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events, or programs. While other information concerning students of the school district remains confidential and will be released only in accordance with the school district's Student Record Policy, the above "directory information," will be released to a requesting party unless a parent/guardian or an adult student advises the school district that such information should not be so released with respect to that particular student. If a parent or adult student desires that the above "directory information" or any part thereof, concerning a particular student not be released, he/she should contact the student's building principal in writing.

DRUG-FREE SCHOOLS

In accordance with federal law, the Board of Education prohibits the use, possession, concealment, or distribution of drugs by students on school grounds, in school or school approved vehicles, or at any school related event. Drugs include any alcoholic beverage, anabolic steroid, dangerous controlled substances as defined by state statute, or substance that could be considered a "lookalike" controlled substance. Compliance with this policy is mandatory for all students. Any student who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with due process and as specified in the student handbook, up to and including expulsion from

school. When required by state law, the district will also notify law enforcement officials. The district is concerned about any student who is a victim of alcohol or drug abuse and will facilitate the process by which s/he receives help through programs and services available in the community. Students and their parents should contact the principal or counseling office whenever such help is needed.

DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION TO THE MILITARY

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) provides for disclosure of a student's personal information to military recruiters upon request unless parents have advised us that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent. If a parent or adult student does not want Whitmore Lake Public Schools to disclose personal information from a student's education records to military recruiters without prior written consent, the building principal must be notified in writing no later than October 7, 2016. Student Privacy & Parental Access to Information The Whitmore Lake Public Schools Board of Education respects the privacy rights of parents and their children. No student shall be required as a part of the school program or the district's curriculum, without prior written consent of the student (if an adult or an emancipated minor), or, if an unemancipated minor, his/her parents, to submit to or participate in any survey, analysis, or evaluation that reveals information concerning political affiliations or beliefs of the student or his/her parents; mental or psychological problems of the student or his/her family; sex behavior or attitudes; illegal, antisocial, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior; critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close, family relationships; legally recognized privileged and analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers; religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or his/her parents; or income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such a program).

RIGHT TO DENY USE OF STUDENT'S IMAGE

WLPS recognizes the value of utilizing audiovisual and other types of electronic communication in providing an effective education for the students of Whitmore

Lake. Unless otherwise notified, the district assumes the parent's permission in the use of your child's image, name, work product, school, and grade for district-prepared printed materials, and in presentations that may be posted on the district website or cable channel. If you do not wish to grant the district this right, please access and return the Student Photograph/Videotape Form on the website at: www.wlps.net/policies.html, or by contacting your specific school building office.

RIGHT TO INSPECT INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

Parents and students may inspect, request, suggest, complain, or file a grievance as it relates to instructional materials such as textbooks, library books, reference works, and other instructional aids used in the district; however, the following procedure must be followed: Complete a "Request for Review of Materials or Course Content" form, which is available at the school office or at the Superintendent's office. Submit the form to the school principal who will respond to your request in accordance with the steps outlined in Board of Education Policy 9130, a copy of which is available online or upon request from the superintendent's office.

NONDISCRIMINATION IN EDUCATION

The Whitmore Lake Public School District hereby agrees that it will comply with federal laws prohibiting discrimination and with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations of the U.S. Department of Education. Therefore, it shall be the policy of the schools that no person, on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, age, sex, or marital status, shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise discriminated against under any federally funded program or activity for which Whitmore Lake Public Schools is responsible or for which it receives federal financial assistance. This policy of non-discrimination shall also apply to otherwise qualified handicapped individuals.

USE OF PESTICIDES

The Michigan Department of Agriculture now requires schools to notify parents when pesticides, herbicides, insecticides, etc. are being applied on school grounds. The Whitmore Lake School District normally applies these chemicals during the summer vacation and other vacation periods when school is not in session. Occasionally, in emergencies, we may be required to apply these chemicals when school is in session. You have the right to be informed prior to any pesticide application made on the school grounds and in buildings. In certain emergencies, pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application. If you want prior notification, please contact the Superintendent's Office at (734) 4494464 by October 7, 2016.

ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act [AHERA] Section 763.93[g], [1.], Management plans for the High School, Middle School, and Elementary School are available for public review. Plans are located at 8845 Main Street Whitmore Lake, Michigan in the District's Maintenance Office, on the district website, and in the office of each building. A request for review can be obtained from the Superintendent's office.

BULLYING AND AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR

It is the policy of the District to provide a safe and nurturing educational environment for all of its students. This policy protects all students from bullying/ aggressive behavior regardless of the subject matter or motivation for such impermissible behavior. Bullying or other aggressive behavior toward a student, whether by other students, staff, or third parties, including Board members, parents, guests, contractors, vendors, and volunteers, is strictly prohibited. This prohibition includes written, physical, verbal, and psychological abuse, including hazing, gestures, comments, threats, or actions to a student, which cause or threaten to cause bodily harm, reasonable fear for personal safety or personal degradation. Demonstration of appropriate behavior, treating others with civility and respect, and refusing to tolerate harassment or bullying is expected of administrators, faculty, staff, and volunteers to provide positive examples for student behavior.

This policy applies to all “at-school” activities in the District, including activities on school property, in a school vehicle, and those occurring off school property if the student or employee is at any school-sponsored, school-approved or school-related activity or function, such as field trips or athletic events where students are under the school’s control, or where an employee is engaged in school business. Misconduct occurring outside of school may also be disciplined if it interferes with the school environment.

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA FOR ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age (“eligible students”) certain rights with respect to the student’s education records.

These rights are:

- (1) The right to inspect and review the student’s education records within 45 days of the day the school receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The school official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.
- (2) The right to request the amendment of the student’s education records that the parent or eligible student believes is inaccurate. Parents or eligible students may ask the school to amend a record that they believe are inaccurate. In writing, notify the school principal (or appropriate school official), clearly identifying the part of the record to be changed, and specify why it is inaccurate. If the school decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the school will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise him/her of his/her right to a hearing regarding the

request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student’s education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the school as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board; a person or company with whom the school has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the school district to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is:

PERSONAL CURRICULUM ALTERNATIVE

Generally, to earn a high school diploma, a student must satisfy the requirements of Michigan’s Merit Curriculum. The District may modify those requirements, however, by developing a personal curriculum for a student. All students are entitled to a personal curriculum. A parent or guardian of a student who has completed 9th grade (or the student if at least 18 years old or emancipated), or a student’s teacher or counselor, may request a personal curriculum by contacting Kathy DeKeyser at 734.449.4461 x3008. A group that includes the student; the student’s parent or guardian; and a teacher, guidance counselor, or person acting in a counseling role, will consider the request. If the personal curriculum request is made by a student who is at least 18 or who is emancipated, or by a parent or guardian, the group will grant the request and will develop a personal curriculum for the student. For all other requests, the group will develop a personal curriculum if the group determines one is appropriate. For most students, the group that develops the personal curriculum may make only certain modifications to the Merit Curriculum. For students with disabilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and for certain students transferring to the District from a non-public school or from out of state,

the group may make additional modifications. For all students, a personal curriculum must incorporate as much of the Michigan Merit Curriculum content expectations as is practicable for the student; must include measurable goals for the student to achieve while in high school; must include a method to evaluate whether the student met those goals; and must align with the student's educational development plan. Before a personal curriculum becomes effective, the Superintendent, Tom DeKeyser, and the student's parent or guardian (or the student if at least 18 or emancipated) must agree to its terms. Once effective, the student's parent or guardian (or the student if at least 18 or emancipated) must communicate with each of the student's teachers to monitor the student's progress on the personal curriculum goals. A student who successfully satisfies his or her personal curriculum may earn a high school diploma even if the student does not otherwise satisfy all of the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements.
