OPERATING Millage

VOTE MAY 2



Primary residences are not taxed with this 10-year millage.

Only businesses and second homes/property are impacted.



This millage pays for essential day-to-day operations

from teacher salaries to building utilities. If it does not pass, WLPS will lose over \$400k in funding over 5 years*.



This is nothing new.

The last time voters renewed an operating millage for WLPS was in 2016. However, that operating millage has eroded to 17.9458 and will continue to decrease as property values change. A yes vote will get WLPS back to an 18 mills operating millage.

- Voting YES will let us continue to levy the required 18 mills AND have 3 mills to mitigate tax erosion as property values change.
- Voting NO means **WLPS will lose over \$400k in state funding** over 5 years.*
- Operating Millages are required by law for school districts to receive per/student funding from the State of Michigan.
