Vaccination Reminders

VACCINE**	AGES 4-6	AGES 7-18 Including 7th Grade Students
Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis	4 doses of DTP or DTap, one dose must be on or after 4 years of age	4 doses D and T or 3 doses if #1 given on or after the first birthday. One dose of Tdap for children 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher
Polio	4 doses; if dose 3 administered on or after 4 years of age, only 3 doses are required	4 doses of polio. Only 3 doses of polio are required if dose 3 is administered on or after 4 years of age
Measles* Mumps* Rubella*	2 doses on or after 12 months of age	2 doses on or after 12 months of age
Hepatitis B *	3 doses	3 doses

A Look Ahead

L

et’s review...We balanced the budget by the middle of last year and concluded the year with a surplus. To celebrate, we hosted a carnival! Well, maybe that wasn’t the real reason for Celebrate Whitmore Lake, but we should take some time to celebrate where we are and all we have to look forward to with the upcoming school year.

- We increased our district fund balance from below 1% at its lowest to 5% in less than a year, securing our financial stability.
- This school year we are adding art to our teaching rotation at the elementary school.
- We have been meeting with teachers this summer to create a more student-centered scheduling process that matches ability level and pacing to what is taught in the upper grades (5th and 6th). In other words, age isn’t the only criteria we are and will be using when placing students in our English and math classes, increasing our personalized learning approach.
- We are adding staff to allow for classes that target students with special needs in our primary grades.
- Secondary programming will see an additional Advance Placement course and a stronger social studies curriculum with the integration of online and interactive textbooks in 7th and 8th grades.
- We have boosted the safety level at each building by adding special cameras for building entry.
- We successfully completed a year of testing and are prepping for the change from an ACT based test to the SAT test at the high school.

Did I mention we did all that and increased our fund balance?

Operating our district with a balanced budget is important. And clearly, we cannot and should not wait for our legislators in Lansing to figure out a more equitable funding model. Believe me, the WLPS Board of Education has tried and continues to take the issue of equitable funding right to the desk of the governor. Just this past winter, our Board passed a resolution pushing our legislators to act on our behalf and on behalf of all children in this region. But whether or not our elected officials act on it is outside our control. We need to continue to take care of our students and secure the future of our community schools. Our small classes combined with an incredibly safe environment are two things WLPS will always have, and these two important characteristics of our schools are coveted by our neighbors.

This school year, my first full year as superintendent, I want to keep our small classes and safety in our buildings a priority. I want to continue to expand programming for our students. I am working with a variety of educational partners and with our staff to find cost-effective ways to meet the needs of all students who attend our schools. I believe our mission to provide an exceptional, personalized education is profound, and I am motivated by it daily.

As summer hits its last month and we prepare to open this September, please take advantage of this Back to School Guide. It is loaded with all the information you, as parents, need to get your children re-engaged and ready to learn this year.

It’s a great day to be a Trojan.

A

fter graduating high school, I was unsure of what career I wanted to pursue, like many kids are. I decided to go to WCC, and I worked in construction to pay for my classes. I was always told to get a degree so I wouldn't have to work in construction the rest of my life. The problem was, I really liked construction. I realized that even though there seemed to be a stigma around it, the construction industry was where I wanted to be.

I'm glad I chose to pursue my interest in building and remodeling. There are many fulfilling jobs available in the construction industry. Furthermore, there currently is a shortage of skilled workers that is predicted to continue to grow. There are careers to be had if you have the right skills and a passion for this industry.

I would highly encourage students to think about what they feel most fulfilled doing. If they don't know the answer to that, it might take some experimenting with different classes and/or jobs. Community College is a great place to take a variety of classes at an affordable price. I think kids feel pressured to go to a four year college right out of high school. While this route is great for some, it is not for everybody. Trade schools and community colleges are a great alternative. Too many people are graduating with a bachelor's degree, a lot of debt, and are either unable to get a job or still unsure what career they want to pursue. I want kids to know there are other options out there and not to be afraid to take an untraditional route.

I am very grateful for my educational experience at WLPS. I definitely benefited from the small school atmosphere. The teachers, coaches, and staff knew who you were and genuinely cared about you. They really wanted you to succeed and excel in life.

I chose to take an untraditional path after graduating high school. After completing my liberal arts associate's degree from Washtenaw Community College, I continued to take various classes there (mostly in construction). I worked full time in construction while going to school, sometimes working more than 60-70 hours a week. I started a remodeling company, Ann Arbor Remodeling LLC., 2.5 years ago. I currently employ two full-time workers and two part-time employees. We are a full-service remodeling company with the capabilities of a licensed builder to handle any job, big or small. **DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION**

If you do not want the following information available to the public, notify your building principal before October 7, 2015.

**DESIGNATION OF “DIRECTORY INFORMATION”**

In accordance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 USC 1232[g]), the Board of Education of the Whitmore Lake Public School District has designated the following information as directory information: a student’s name; the image or likeness in pictures, videotape, film website, or other medium; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; degrees and awards received; and school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events, or programs. While other information concerning students of the school district remains confidential and will be released only in accordance with the school district’s Student Record Policy, the above “directory information,” will be released to a requesting party unless a parent/guardian or an adult student advises the school district that such information should not be so released with respect to that particular student. If a parent or adult student desires that the above “directory information” or any part thereof, concerning a particular student not be released, he/she should contact the student’s building principal in writing.

**DRUG-FREE SCHOOLS**

In accordance with federal law, the Board of Education prohibits the use, possession, concealment, or distribution of drugs by students on school grounds, in school or school approved

vehicles, or at any school related event. Drugs include any alcoholic beverage, anabolic steroid, dangerous controlled substances as defined by state statute, or substance that could be considered a “lookalike” controlled substance. Compliance with this policy is mandatory for all students. Any student who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with due process and as specified in the student handbook, up to and including expulsion from school. When required by state law, the district will also notify law enforcement officials. The district is concerned about any student who is a victim of alcohol or drug abuse and will facilitate the process by which s/he receives help through programs and services available in the community. Students and their parents should contact the principal or counseling office whenever such help is needed.

**DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION TO THE MILITARY**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) provides for disclosure of a student’s personal information to military recruiters upon request unless parents have advised us that they do not want their student’s information disclosed without their prior written consent. If a parent or adult student does not want Whitmore Lake Public Schools to disclose personal information from a student’s education records to military recruiters without prior written consent, the building principal must be notified in writing no later than October 7, 2015. Student Privacy & Parental Access to Information The Whitmore Lake Public Schools Board of Education respects the privacy rights of parents and their children. No student shall be required as a part of the school program or the district’s curriculum, without prior written consent of the student (if an adult or an emancipated minor), or, if an unemancipated minor, his/her parents, to submit to or participate in any survey, analysis, or evaluation that reveals information concerning political affiliations or beliefs of the student or his/her parents; mental or psychological problems of the student or his/her family; sex behavior or attitudes; illegal, antisocial, selfincriminating, or demeaning behavior; critical

appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close, family relationships; legallyrecognized privileged and analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers; religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or his/her parents; or income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such a program).

**RIGHT TO DENY USE OF STUDENT’S IMAGE**

WLPS recognizes the value of utilizing audiovisual and other types of electronic communication in providing an effective education for the students of Whitmore Lake. Unless otherwise notified, the district assumes the parent’s permission in the use of your child’s image, name, work product, school, and grade for district-prepared printed materials, and in presentations that may be posted on the district website or cable channel. If you do not wish to grant the district this right, please access and return the Student Photograph/Videotape Form on the website at: [www.wlps.net/policies.html](http://www.wlps.net/policies.html), or by contacting your specific school building office.

**RIGHT TO INSPECT INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS**

Parents and students may inspect, request, suggest, complain, or file a grievance as it relates to instructional materials such as textbooks, library books, reference works, and other instructional aids used in the district; however, the following procedure must be followed: Complete a “Request for Review of Materials or Course Content” form, which is available at the school office or at the Superintendent’s office. Submit the form to the school principal who will respond to your request in accordance with the steps outlined in Board of Education Policy 9130, a copy of which is available online or upon request from the superintendent’s office.

**NONDISCRIMINATION IN EDUCATION**

The Whitmore Lake Public School District hereby agrees that it will comply with federal laws prohibiting discrimination and with all

requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations of the U.S. Department of Education. Therefore, it shall be the policy of the schools that no person, on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, age, sex, or marital status, shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise discriminated against under any federally funded program or activity for which Whitmore Lake Public Schools is responsible or for which it receives federal financial assistance. This policy of non-discrimination shall also apply to otherwise qualified handicapped individuals.

**USE OF PESTICIDES**

The Michigan Department of Agriculture now requires schools to notify parents when pesticides, herbicides, insecticides, etc. are being applied on school grounds. The Whitmore Lake School District normally applies these chemicals during the summer vacation and other vacation periods when school is not in session. Occasionally, in emergencies, we may be required to apply these chemicals when school is in session. You have the right to be informed prior to any pesticide application made on the school grounds and in buildings. In certain emergencies, pesticides may be applied without prior notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application. If you want prior notification, please contact the Superintendent’s Office at (734) 4494464 by October 7, 2015.

**ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT**

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act [AHERA] Section 763.93[g], [1.], Management plans for the High School, Middle School, and Elementary School are available for public review. Plans are located at 8845 Main Street Whitmore Lake, Michigan in the District’s Maintenance Office, on the district website, and in the office of each building. A request for review can be obtained from the Superintendent’s office.

**BULLYING AND AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR**

It is the policy of the District to provide a safe and nurturing educational environment for all of its students. This policy protects all students from bullying/aggressive behavior regardless of the subject matter or motivation for such impermissible behavior. Bullying or other aggressive behavior toward a student, whether by other students, staff, or third parties, including Board members, parents, guests, contractors, vendors, and volunteers, is strictly prohibited. This prohibition includes written, physical, verbal, and psychological abuse, including hazing, gestures, comments, threats, or actions to a student, which cause or threaten to cause bodily harm, reasonable fear for personal safety or personal degradation. Demonstration of appropriate behavior, treating others with civility and respect, and refusing to tolerate harassment or bullying is expected of administrators, faculty, staff, and volunteers to provide positive examples for student behavior. This policy applies to all “at-school” activities in the District, including activities on school property, in a school vehicle, and those occurring off school property if the student or employee is at any school-sponsored, school-approved or school-related activity or function, such as field trips or athletic events where students are under the school’s control, or where an employee is engaged in school business. Misconduct occurring outside of school may also be disciplined if it interferes with the school environment.

**NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA FOR ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age (“eligible students”) certain rights with respect to the student’s education records.

These rights are:

(1) The right to inspect and review the student’s education records within 45 days of the day the school receives a request for access. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The school official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student

of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

(2) The right to request the amendment of the student’s education records that the parent or eligible student believes is inaccurate. Parents or eligible students may ask the school to amend a record that they believe are inaccurate. In writing, notify the school principal (or appropriate school official), clearly identifying the part of the record to be changed, and specify why it is inaccurate. If the school decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the school will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise him/her of his/her right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student’s education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the school as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board; a person or company with whom the school has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the school district to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA is: Family Policy Compliance Office/ U.S. Department of Education

**PERSONAL CURRICULUM ALTERNATIVE**

Generally, to earn a high school diploma, a student must satisfy the requirements of Michigan’s Merit Curriculum. The District may modify those requirements, however, by developing a personal curriculum for a student. All students are entitled to a personal curriculum. A parent or guardian of a student who has completed 9th grade (or the student if at least 18 years old or emancipated), or a student’s teacher or counselor, may request a personal curriculum by contacting Kathy DeKeyser at 734.449.4461 x3008. A group that includes the student; the student’s parent or guardian; and a teacher, guidance counselor, or person acting in a counseling role, will consider the request. If the personal curriculum request is made by a student who is at least 18 or who is emancipated, or by a parent or guardian, the group will grant the request and will develop a personal curriculum for the student. For all other requests, the group will develop a personal curriculum if the group determines one is appropriate. For most students, the group that develops the personal curriculum may make only certain modifications to the Merit Curriculum. For students with disabilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and for certain students transferring to the District from a non-public school or from out of state, the group may make additional modifications. For all students, a personal curriculum must incorporate as much of the Michigan Merit Curriculum content expectations as is practicable for the student; must include measurable goals for the student to achieve while in high school; must include a method to evaluate whether the student met those goals; and must align with the student’s educational development plan. Before a personal curriculum becomes effective, the Superintendent, Tom DeKeyser, and the student’s parent or guardian (or the student if at least 18 or emancipated) must agree to its terms. Once effective, the student’s parent or guardian (or the student if at least 18 or emancipated) must communicate with each of the student’s teachers

to monitor the student’s progress on the personal curriculum goals. A student who successfully satisfies his or her personal curriculum may earn a high school diploma even if the student does not otherwise satisfy all of the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements. ## **BOARD OF EDUCATION**
