The nerd in me loves the great American success story of the race to the moon. This summer marked the 50th anniversary of Apollo 11. I was just shy of two-years-old when Neil and Buzz descended to the surface of the moon. During the last moon mission, Apollo 17, I was five. My mom let us watch portions of it on our black and white TV. I was hooked, like most of the USA, on space travel and proud of my country. I wanted so badly to get involved.

Now, what I find most intriguing about the race to the moon is how and why it started. It was driven by a president’s eagerness to advance our country past the U.S.S.R. at the height of the Cold War. JFK made it a goal, a mission, to be first on the moon by the end of the ’60s. It, of course, was a significant scientific and technological undertaking. The mission was aimed at bringing our country together; it was something in which we could all be involved.

WLPS has taken many small steps and a few giant leaps at improving the experience of our students at Whitmore Lake Public Schools. Here are just a few examples:

- Everybody learns to swim. From Kindergarten to High School, if students are involved with our schools, they are swimming.
- Dedicated STEM and Project Based Learning at grades 5 and 6.
- Every student takes an Advanced Placement course in high school. 94% of students who took an AP test last year, passed an AP test earning them college credit.
- Early elementary literacy and math programs that have produced 3rd-grade MSTEP scores that top all Livingston County schools and are just behind Ann Arbor schools.

These examples are testimonies to the work we do in Whitmore Lake. At times it feels like we are trying to land on the moon. The job is hard. But it is a job we love. It is a job we are good at. We continually focus on the experience our students have in the classrooms. It is our mission to the moon.

More and more our mission, like Apollo 11, relies on the integration of technology. We are consistently bringing in new devices and replacing infrastructure assembled in the early 2000s. After evaluating our district’s technology needs last year, we know we need a serious dose of concentrated technology to get us where we want to be.

In the 2019-20 school year, our students will see an influx of technology as we work to enhance the instructional strategies we know have the highest correlation to learning - personal feedback on learning objectives. Our teachers will be given tools which make them more mobile in the classroom. They will be able to interact with students more using instructional technology while moving around the classrooms.

Each improvement we make is a small step forward. Each small step gets us closer to our mission of providing an exceptional, personalized education. Collectively, all these small steps made for our students turn into one big, giant leap for our community.

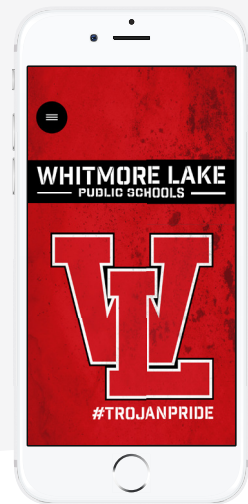

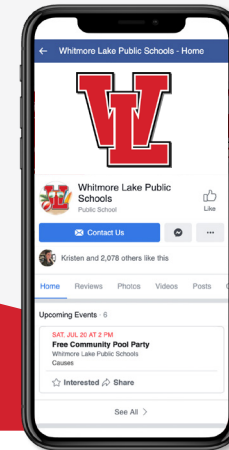

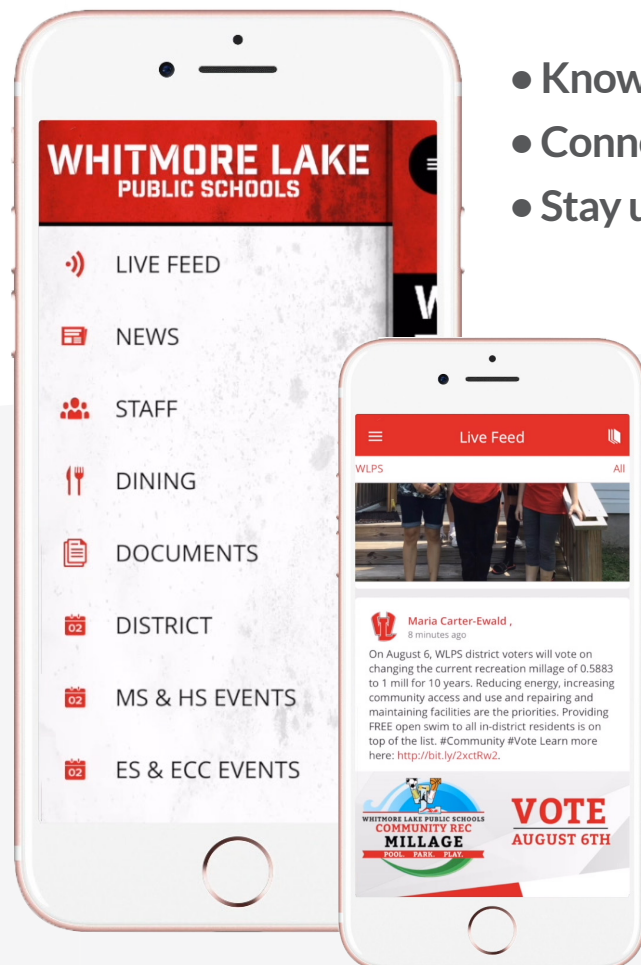

## OUR PROGRAMS:



**HEAD START:**

A free, federally-funded full-day program for children from low-income families, children with special needs, children living in temporary conditions, and children in the Foster Care System. Eligible children must be 3 or 4 years old by December 1, 2019.



**EARLY CHILDHOOD SPECIAL EDUCATION (ECSE):**

A half-day preschool program for children with special needs.



**GREAT START READINESS PROGRAM (GSRP):**

The Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP), is a free, state-funded preschool program for low- to moderate-income families with qualifying children who will be 4 years old by December 1, 2019.



**ENRICHMENT PRESCHOOL:**

This tuition-based program allows parents to choose the days and hours they would like their child to attend in half and full day sessions.



**KIDS CLUB:**

Tuition-based extended-day programs offered four days per week from 6:00 AM until school starts and after school until 6:00 PM. Also available on “no school” days, half-days and snow days.



**ECC PLAYGROUPS:**

Playgroups begin Friday, October 4th! Offered Fridays from 9:30 AM - 11:30 AM for children ages 0-5 years. These are sliding scale tuition-based playgroups that parents attend with their child for activities, fun and socialization.

## DESIGNATION OF “DIRECTORY INFORMATION”

In accordance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 USC 1232[g]), the Board of Education of the Whitmore Lake Public School District has designated the following information as directory information: a student’s name; the image or likeness in pictures, videotape, film website, or other medium; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; degrees and awards received; and school photographs or videos of students participating in school activities, events, or programs. While other information concerning students of the school district remains confidential and will be released only in accordance with the school district’s Student Record Policy, the above “directory information,” will be released to a requesting party unless a parent/guardian or an adult student advises the school district that such information should not be so released with respect to that particular student. If a parent or adult student desires that the above “directory information” or any part thereof, concerning a particular student not be released, he/she should contact the student’s building principal in writing.

## DISCLOSURE OF DIRECTORY INFORMATION

If you do not want the following information available to the public, notify your building principal before October 7, 2019.

## DRUG-FREE SCHOOLS

In accordance with federal law, the Board of Education prohibits the use, possession, concealment, or distribution of drugs by students on school grounds, in school or school-approved vehicles, or at any school-related event. Drugs include any alcoholic beverage, anabolic steroid, dangerous controlled substances as defined by state statute, or substance that could be considered a “lookalike” controlled substance. Compliance with this policy is mandatory for all students. Any student who violates this policy will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with due process and as specified in the student handbook, up to and including expulsion from

school. When required by state law, the district will also notify law enforcement officials. The district is concerned about any student who is a victim of alcohol or drug abuse and will facilitate the process by which s/he receives help through programs and services available in the community. Students and their parents should contact the principal or counseling office whenever such help is needed.

## DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION TO THE MILITARY

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) provides for disclosure of a student’s personal information to military recruiters upon request unless parents have advised us that they do not want their student’s information disclosed without their prior written consent. If a parent or adult student does not want Whitmore Lake Public Schools to disclose personal information from a student’s education records to military recruiters without prior written consent, the building principal must be notified in writing no later than October 7, 2019.

## STUDENT PRIVACY & PARENTAL ACCESS TO INFORMATION

The Whitmore Lake Public Schools Board of Education respects the privacy rights of parents and their children. No student shall be required as a part of the school program or the district’s curriculum, without prior written consent of the student (if an adult or an emancipated minor), or, if an unemancipated minor, his/her parents, to submit to or participate in any survey, analysis, or evaluation that reveals information concerning political affiliations or beliefs of the student or his/her parents; mental or psychological problems of the student or his/her family; sex behavior or attitudes; illegal, antisocial, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior; critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close, family relationships; legally recognized privileged and analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers; religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or his/her parents; or income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such a program).

## RIGHT TO DENY USE OF STUDENT’S IMAGE

WLPS recognizes the value of utilizing audiovisual and other types of electronic communication in providing an effective education for the students of Whitmore Lake. Unless otherwise notified, the district assumes the parent’s permission in the use of your child’s image, name, work product, school, and grade for district-prepared printed materials, and in presentations that may be posted on the district website or cable channel. If you do not wish to grant the district this right, please access and return the Student Photograph/Videotape Form on the website at: <http://www.wlps.net/school-policy-notices/> or by contacting your specific school building office.

## RIGHT TO INSPECT INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

Parents and students may inspect, request, suggest, complain, or file a grievance as it relates to instructional materials such as textbooks, library books, reference works, and other instructional aids used in the district; however, the following procedure must be followed: Complete a “Request for Review of Materials or Course Content” form, which is available at the school office or at the Superintendent’s Office. Submit the form to the school principal who will respond to your request in accordance with the steps outlined in Board of Education Policy 9130, a copy of which is available online or upon request from the Superintendent’s Office.

## NONDISCRIMINATION IN EDUCATION

The Whitmore Lake Public School District hereby agrees that it will comply with federal laws prohibiting discrimination and with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations of the U.S. Department of Education. Therefore, it shall be the policy of the schools that no person, on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, age, sex, or marital status, shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise discriminated against under any federally-funded program or activity for which Whitmore Lake Public Schools is responsible or for which it receives federal financial assistance. This policy of non-discrimination shall also apply to otherwise qualified handicapped individuals.

## USE OF PESTICIDES

The Michigan Department of Agriculture now requires schools to notify parents when pesticides, herbicides, insecticides, etc. are being applied on school grounds. The Whitmore Lake School District normally applies these chemicals during the summer vacation and other vacation periods when school is not in session. Occasionally, in emergencies, we may be required to apply these chemicals when school is in session. You have the right to be informed prior to any pesticide application made on the school grounds and in buildings. In certain emergencies, pesticides may be applied without prior

notice, but you will be provided notice following any such application. If you want prior notification, please contact the Superintendent’s Office at (734) 449-4464 by October 7, 2019.

## ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act [AHERA] Section 763.93[g], [1.], Management plans for the High School, Middle School, and Elementary School are available for public review. Plans are located at 8845 Main Street Whitmore Lake, Michigan in the District’s Maintenance Office, on the district website, and in the office of each building. A request for review can be obtained from the Superintendent’s Office.

## BULLYING AND AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR

It is the policy of the District to provide a safe and nurturing educational environment for all of its students. This policy protects all students from bullying/aggressive behavior regardless of the subject matter or motivation for such impermissible behavior. Bullying or other aggressive behavior toward a student, whether by other students, staff, or third parties, including Board members, parents, guests, contractors, vendors, and volunteers, is strictly prohibited. This prohibition includes written, physical, verbal, and psychological abuse, including hazing, gestures, comments, threats, or actions to a student, which cause or threaten to cause bodily harm, reasonable fear for personal safety or personal degradation. Demonstration of appropriate behavior, treating others with civility and respect, and refusing to tolerate harassment or bullying is expected of administrators, faculty, staff, and volunteers to provide positive examples for student behavior.

This policy applies to all “at-school” activities in the District, including activities on school property, in a school vehicle, and those occurring off school property if the student or employee is at any school-sponsored, school-approved or school-related activity or function, such as field trips or athletic events where students are under the school’s control, or where an employee is engaged in school business. Misconduct occurring off campus may also be disciplined if it interferes with the school environment.

NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA FOR  
ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE, AND HIGH SCHOOL  
The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)  
affords parents and students over 18  
years of age (“eligible students”) certain rights with  
respect to the student’s education records.  
These rights are:

(1) The right to inspect and review the student’s education  
records within 45 days of the day the school receives a  
request for access. Parents or eligible students should  
submit to the school principal (or appropriate school  
official) a written request that identifies the record(s)  
they wish to inspect. The school official will make  
arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible  
student of the time and place where the records may be  
inspected. (2) The right to request the amendment of the  
student’s education records that the parent or eligible  
student believes is inaccurate. Parents or eligible students  
may ask the school to amend a record that they believe  
are inaccurate. In writing, notify the school principal (or  
appropriate school official), clearly identifying the part of  
the record to be changed, and specify why it is inaccurate.  
If the school decides not to amend the record as  
requested by the parent or eligible student, the school will  
notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and  
advise him/her of his/her right to a hearing regarding the  
request for amendment. Additional information regarding  
the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or  
eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.  
(3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally  
identifiable information contained in the student’s  
education records, except to the extent that FERPA  
authorizes disclosure without consent. One exception,  
which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure  
to school officials with legitimate educational interests.  
A school official is a person employed by the school  
as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support  
staff member (including health or medical staff and  
law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on  
the school board; a person or company with whom the  
school has contracted to perform a special task (such as  
an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist);  
or a parent or student serving on an official committee,  
such as a disciplinary or grievance committee or assisting  
another school official in performing his or her tasks. A  
school official has a legitimate educational interest if the  
official needs to review an education record in order to  
fulfill his or her professional responsibility.  
(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S.  
Department of Education concerning alleged failures  
by the school district to comply with the requirements

PERSONAL CURRICULUM ALTERNATIVE  
Generally, to earn a high school diploma, a student must  
satisfy the requirements of Michigan’s Merit Curriculum.  
The District may modify those requirements, however,  
by developing a personal curriculum for a student. All  
students are entitled to a personal curriculum. A parent  
or guardian of a student who has completed 9th grade  
(or the student if at least 18 years old or emancipated),  
or a student’s teacher or counselor, may request a  
personal curriculum by contacting Kathy DeKeyser  
at (734) 449-4461 x3008. A group that includes the  
student; the student’s parent or guardian; and a teacher,  
guidance counselor, or person acting in a counseling  
role, will consider the request. If the personal curriculum  
request is made by a student who is at least 18 or who is  
emancipated, or by a parent or guardian, the group will  
grant the request and will develop a personal curriculum  
for the student. For all other requests, the group will  
develop a personal curriculum if the group determines  
one is appropriate. For most students, the group that  
develops the personal curriculum may make only certain  
modifications to the Merit Curriculum. For students  
with disabilities under the Individuals with Disabilities  
Education Act and for certain students transferring to  
the District from a non-public school or from out of state,  
the group may make additional modifications. For all  
students, a personal curriculum must incorporate as much  
of the Michigan Merit Curriculum content expectations  
as is practicable for the student; must include measurable  
goals for the student to achieve while in high school; must  
include a method to evaluate whether the student met  
those goals; and must align with the student’s educational  
development plan. Before a personal curriculum becomes  
effective, the Superintendent, Tom DeKeyser, and the  
student’s parent or guardian (or the student if at least 18  
or emancipated) must agree to its terms. Once effective,  
the student’s parent or guardian (or the student if at least  
18 or emancipated) must communicate with each of the  
student’s teachers to monitor the student’s progress on  
the personal curriculum goals. A student who successfully  
satisfies his or her personal curriculum may earn a high  
school diploma even if the student does not otherwise  
satisfy all of the Michigan Merit Curriculum requirements.
